The islands offer a variety of dining experiences, from world class to enjoyably simple, all of which which play an important part in Grenadian life and culture. Restaurants tend towards chic informality, many being outdoors, taking advantage of the cooling trade winds to create a uniquely West Indian ambience.

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Fresh seafood is a must and new visitors should not leave Grenada without sampling the 'Conch'. Local restaurants outside of the hotels are definitely worth a visit and many feature local game such as Manicou.

The following is just a selection of those recommended by Peter de Savary...it will give you an idea of the vast array of choice that's available.

### Almost Paradise Cottages and Bar

Come north as far as you can go to (almost) paradise, just west of Sauteurs. Lunch at Almost Paradise is not to be missed and on a clear day, you'll enjoy views all the way to St Vincent. Try a delicious local soup or salad or one of the renowned fish or chicken dinners.
